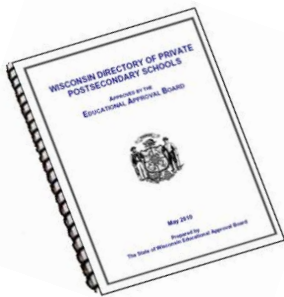

The Wisconsin Directory of Private Postsecondary Schools is being provided in a “green” format. The directory, which is published annually by the Educational Approval Board (EAB) and is designed to inform prospective students and other interested persons about the education and training programs available from EAB-approved schools, can be accessed at any time from the EAB’s website by going to <<http://eab.state.wi.us/resources/directory.pdf>>.

The EAB’s website also provides the ability to perform interactive school and program searches. You can search the EAB’s database by school name, program name, program type, or city by going to <<http://eab.state.wi.us/resources/schoolsprogram.asp>>. When viewing a particular school, you can find the same information that is published in the directory, with the added benefit of getting real-time updates and student outcomes data by program for a particular school.



The EAB protects Wisconsin consumers by regulating more than 180 for-profit and non-profit schools, colleges and universities¹. These institutions offer more than 800 degree and non-degree programs to over 59,000 Wisconsin adults each year. These programs are very diverse and in a number of instances quite unique. Included are programs for truck driving, massage therapy, home inspection, teacher licensure, IT certification, instrument repair, as well as traditional associate’s, bachelor’s and master’s degrees.
